For many of us loved ones who have died have been such a large part of Christmases in the past that we need to acknowledge the gap that they have left in our lives at this special time.

For others the pain of broken relationships may be why we are here tonight. For some of us life is already stressed, without the additional expectations and busyness and expense of Christmas and need some "time out".

Some of us have health concerns, for ourselves or someone we are close to. All of us need the hope and peace that the Christ-child can bring, and to know that we are not alone.

Our prayer is that as you experience this service tonight, and as you think about the Christmas message, you'll find comfort and hope. That you discover the light in the darkness.

Lighting the second outer candle: Peace

God of mystery, we turn our hearts to you. We come before you in need of peace, grateful for the mystery of life and ever keenly aware of your promises of guidance and protection. We want to place our trust in you, but our hearts grow fearful and anxious. We forget so easily that you will be with us in all that we experience. Teach us to be patient with the transformation of our lives and to be open to the changes which we are now going through.

Focussing on the central candle

Lighting of candles and creating a heart wreath

Each of us comes bearing our own hurts, sorrows, broken places. I want to invite each of you to offer your personal wound to the God who loves each of us deeply and wants to carry our pain. God waits patiently, gently calling out: "Give me your pain, come to me...all who labour and are heavy laden and I will refresh you."

I invite each of you to come forward and light your candle. As you light the candle, remember that it is God who lights a candle in our darkness and holds us close until we are able to shine.

You may also wish to write a word or a name of someone or something special to you on your heart card, and to come up and place it on our heart wreath. Remember that God hears our prayers and holds us all in his love.

After candles have been lit and hearts placed on the wreath, silence is kept.

These lights in their brightness are only symbols, but as they burn and finally go out, we remember that suffering passes, though memory remains forever.

Dispel the clouds and reveal your glory.
